Udiskie is a <i>very</i> useful program that works with udisks/udisks2 to auto mount any storage devices that are plugged in. There is a systemd service but no OpenRC init script that I've been able to find searching the internet and Gentoo wiki.	
I tried writing my own but ran into issues since it ended up auto mounting to /run/media/root instead of /run/media/\$USER, even with "run user" added.
