When I've updated the XFCE desktop to the version 4.14.1, the interface got buggy. Then, when I ran XFCE Window Manager, it displayed the following message:	
<pre>xfwm4: error while loading shared libraries: libxfconf-0.so.2: cannot open shared object file: No such file or directory</pre>	
It makes that the title bar disappears, and avoid to exchange the windows with the Alt + Tab hotkey.	
If this error present on Arch, I'll link this message for spread the bug.
