If an Arch user wants to install [linux-libre] side-by-side with [linux], to try it out, there is no reason why they shouldn't be able to do that. However, currently, linux-libre conflicts=(linux), meaning that we've artificially made it harder.	
Of course, the reason we do that is because of the goal that a Parabola system with your-freedom installed conflicts with all non-free packages from Arch. your-freedom can't conflict with linux directly, because that would also conflict with packages that provide=(linux), including linux-libre! So, the solution has been to have the replacing package conflict with the Arch version.	
One solution might be to remove the conflicts=(linux) from the version posted to AUR, but leave it in the Parabola version. I don't like that, it's inelegant, increases developer overhead, and also means that prospective users can't just get our binary.	
I believe a similar situation is happening with iceweasel/firefox, but I'd have to check.
